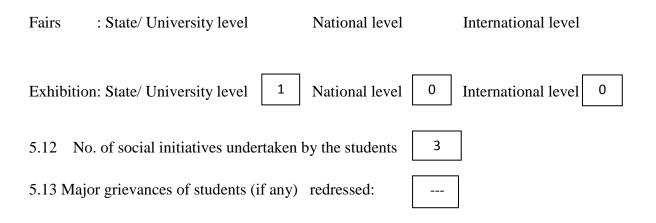

2) <u>1.3.1Alumni association</u>:

Our College organised the Alumni Association Meet on 6.9.14. Mrs.R.Priya, M.A., B.Ed., M.Phil., Assistant Professor in English, V.V.V College for Women, Virudhunagar was the guest of the function. She broached the audience by saying Alexander's quotes "I am indebted to my father for living, but to my teacher for living well" to eulogize the teachers. She recollected her memories during her college days. She said, "My teachers are my role model so as I am".

On 7.4.2015, twenty five alumnae students of 1987-1990 batches visited the college and cherished their memories after the completion of 25 years of education in our institution. They met the faculty and interacted with the students.

<u>1.3.2 Feedback from Parents (2014 – 2015)</u>

A feed back from parents was collected for the Academic year 2014-2015.

The parents were asked to state their opinion, for 16 statements by selecting the options under three heads namely **"good" "Satisfactory"** and **"Requires improvement"**. The parents were given options to select any one of the three options for these sixteen statements.

The options of parents were about:

- 1. Learning skills of students.
- 2. Skill development program.
- 3. Spoken language skill.
- 4. Students willingness to go for higher studies.
- 5. Utility of curriculum.
- 6. Ability of teaching staff.
- 7. Teacher-Student relationship.
- 8. Role of the college in getting employment opporunities.
- 9. Contribution of college towards students' discipline.
- 10. Role of the college in developing social awareness.
- 11. Drinking water Facilities.
- 12. Transport Facilities.
- 13. Classroom Facilities.
- 14. Library Facilities.
- 15. Canteen Facilities.
- 16. Hostel Facilities.

Findings:

The parents were much satisfied about:

- 1. Teacher Student relationship-97%
- 2. Students discipline-95%
- 3. Teaching Skill-95%

- 4. Role of the college in creating in Social Awareness-95%
- 5. Utility of curriculum 88%
- 6. Transport facilities 86%
- 7. Library Facilities 84%
- 8. Hostel Facilities-83%
- 9. Canteen Facilities 83%
- 10. Interest of students in higher Studies 82%
- 11. Classroom Facilities -79%
- 12. Employment Opportunities Provided- 74%
- 13. Skill development course 72%
- 14. Learning Skill of student 65%
- 15. Drinking water Facilities -60%
- 16. Spoken language skill 55%

The above analysis implies the opinion of the parents towards the facilities available, students - staff relationship and courses offered in the college.

Suggestions:-

- 1. Students strength in spoken language course must be increased.
- 2. Drinking water- outlets should be increased.
- 3. Learning skills can be enhanced through smart class, PowerPoint presentation and laptop usage.
- 4. Skill development Courses can be increased.
- 5. Innovative programs in career development, self employment and

Entrepreneurial development programs should be given more importance.

1.3.3 Feedback from Curriculum cell - By the students

Feed back on curriculam was collected from all the final year graduates and post graduates of all disciplines. The students were asked to rate the course on 7 parameters using 4 point scaling technique. The parameters were depth of course content, extent of coverage, relevance to real life situation, learning value, clarity and relevence of textual reading material, relevance of additional source material and the extend of effort required by the students.

Analysis and Findings:

4 point scaling technique was used for expressing the opinion of students on curriculum. For each parameter the students were asked to select anyone of the four options like 'Very Good', 'Good', Satisfactory', and 'unsatisfactory'. The scores given by the students were '4 marks' for 'Very Good' option, '3 marks' for 'Good', '2marks' for 'satisfactory' and '1 mark' for 'unsatisfactory' option. Accordingly the total score of all the 7 parameters were arrived out and the maximum score was calculated as 28(7x4). If the total score was greater than 21, then the result was considered as very good. If the score was 15 to 21 then the result was good, if the score was 8 to 14 then the result was satisfactory and if the total score was only 7 then the result was considered unsatisfactory.

Findings :

80 to 100 % of the students were very much satisfied with the curriculum and only minimum 7% of the students found certain papers on their major subjects as difficult, almost all the students found the curriculum apt and easy to follow. Efforts were taken for enriching the level of satisfaction towards the curriculum above 90%.

Suggesstions:

1. Recent trends, case studies should be incorporated in curriculum.

2. Use of educational technology like power point presentation by students, web based assignment should be extensively practised.

3. Students should be guided to refer e-books, e-journals and other net sources.

4. E-content development should be emphasised for each and every unit of the subjects in the curriculum.

5. Project work should be insisted for all the students.

6. Group discussion among students, paper presentation and seminars enable the students to understand the concepts easily.

7. Guest lectures must be increased to equip the students with the current trends.

8. Mentor teaching should be followed for problem oriented subjects.

1.4 Revision of syllabus:

1.4. To update the syllabi we revise the syllabi once in three years. Each department takes care to include recent trends, innovative ideas, and career and skill development programs in its curriculum. The Board of Studies meeting will be conducted by the respective department for the approval of syllabi. The Board is consisted of university nominee, subject experts and Alumnus. After the approval of the syllabi by the Board of studies the syllabi will be placed before the Academic Council Meeting. The members of the Academic council are the Principal, Dean of Academic affairs, Director of self financing course State Government Nominees, External Experts, Controller of Examinations .Heads of the Department, Senior Staff Members and Students' representatives. During the Academic year 2014-2015 the Academic Council Meeting was conducted on 13th April 2015. The syllabi of M.Sc., Physics, MCA and M.Phil Mathematics were approved by ACM and the revised syllabus came into effect from the academic year 2015-2016.

3) <u>2.2.12 Teaching and Learning Cell</u>

IQAC – Teaching and Learing cell of our college conducted monitoring and evaluating the teaching, learning process of individual faculty members for all the departments using 3 point scale parameters. 10 percent of final year students in each department were randomly selected by the panel members and they will evaluate our teaching faculties using the following criteria's.

1. <u>Subject Knowledge</u>: 95 % of the students feel our faculty member's subject knowledge was very good.

2. <u>Communication Skill: 80</u>% of the students reported that the Communications Skill among our teaching faculties was very good

3. <u>Methods – Tools used</u>: 85% of the students analysed the usage of OHP, PowerPoint, Smart Classroom and other tools used was very good.

4. <u>Coverage of Syllabus</u>: 85% of the students given covrage of syllabus by our faculties were very good.

5. <u>Punctuality</u>: Punctuality was reported as 90% as very good by the Students.

6. Functional Transparency: It was reported as 87% was very good.

7. Motivating the Students: Motivating the Students was reported as 85%.
