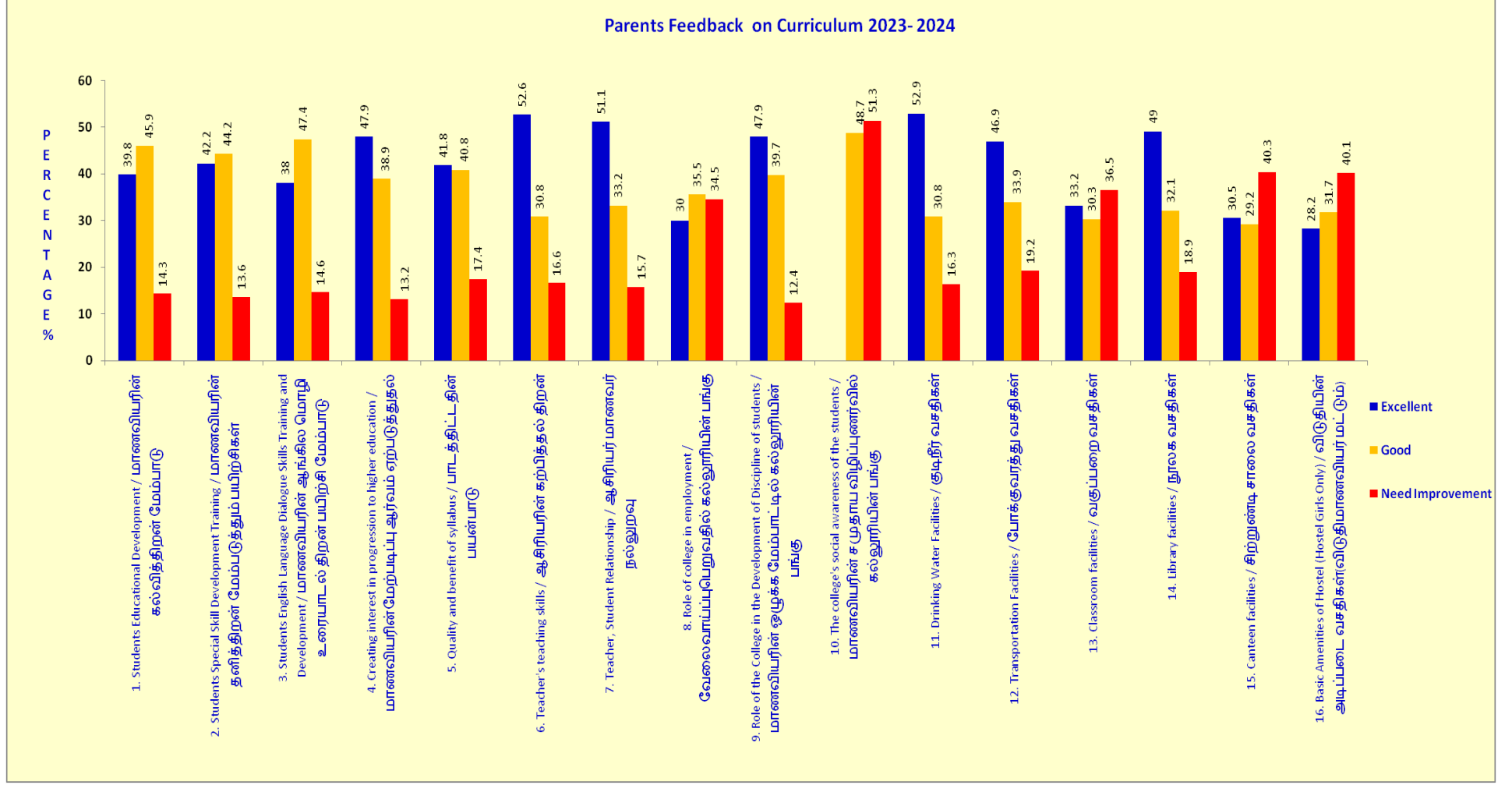


FEEDBACK ANALYSIS
2023 - 2024

The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) at EMG Yadava Women's College aims to improve the quality of education and nurture a culture of excellence within the institution. This feedback report summarizes the perspectives and insights gathered from different stakeholders, such as students, faculty, alumni, and employers, for the academic year 2023-2024. Following the analysis of the feedback, appropriate actions were taken.



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PARENTS FEEDBACK ANALYSIS REPORT ON CURRICULUM 2023-2024

In a college setting, receiving feedback from parents offers multiple benefits that contribute to enhancing the overall educational experience and institutional development. The in-depth analysis of the online Parents' Feedback Survey was conducted for the academic year 2023-2024 using Google Forms, accessible at <https://forms.gle/VpG9xxNCEzgXMHJT9>. The report covers the analysis of responses across various categories and outlines recommendations and actions taken based on the feedback.

1. Students Educational Development

There was a well-balanced distribution. A significant number of parents (39.8%) rated it as good, and 45.9% rated it as excellent. However, 14.3% rated this area as average, indicating some room for improvement.

2. Students' Special Skill Development Training

While 42.2% of parents rated the special skill development training as good and 44.2% as excellent, the 13.6% average rating suggests there is scope for strengthening these programs.

3. Students' English Language Dialogue Skills

With 38% of parents rating this aspect as needing improvement and 47.4% rating it as good, the relatively low excellent rating of 14.6% highlights a need to improve English language dialogue skill training.

4. Creating Interest in Progression to Higher Education

A strong positive result: 47.9% of parents rated this aspect as excellent, 38.9% as good, and 13.2% need improvement. Average ratings indicate some scope for growth, suggesting effective efforts to raise interest in higher education.

5. Quality and Benefits of Syllabus

The syllabus is highly regarded, with 40.8% of parents rating it as good and 41.8% as excellent, while only 17.4% of parents rated it as needing improvement.

6. Teacher's Teaching Skills

Teacher's teaching skills received strong feedback, with 52.6% of parents rating them as excellent and 30.8% as good. Only 16.6% rated them as needing improvement, indicating strong teaching quality.

7. Teacher-Student Relationship

Teacher-student relationships are highly appreciated, with 51.1% of parents rating it as excellent and 33.2% as good. Only 15.7% rated it as needing improvement, showing a healthy engagement between teachers and students.

8. Role of College in Employment

The distribution reveals that slightly more parents rated the college's role in employment as good (35.5%), while a high average rating of 34.5% suggests there is room for improvement in job-oriented support. Additionally, 30% of parents rated the college's efforts in employment as excellent.

9. Role of College in Student Discipline

The college's role in improving student discipline is highly regarded, with 47.9% of parents rating it as excellent and 39.7% as good, leaving only 12.4% for need improvement.

10. College's Social Awareness Initiatives

48.7% of parents rated it as good, and the majority (51.3%) rated it as an improvement. This is an area of concern that requires substantial improvement.

11. Drinking Water Facilities

Drinking water facilities are highly rated, with 52.9% of parents giving them an excellent rating and 30.8% rating them as good. Only 16.3% found them to need improvement.

12. Transportation Facilities

Transportation facilities received positive feedback, with 46.9% excellent and 33.9% good ratings. The average rating (19.2%) shows that while the services are generally appreciated, there is still some room for improvement.

13. Classroom Facilities

With a relatively high percentage of parents (36.5%) rating classroom facilities as average, there is a need for improvement. Only 33.2% rated them as excellent, while 30.3% found them good.

14. Library Facilities

Library facilities are well-regarded, with nearly half of the parents (49%) rating them as excellent and 32.1% as good. This indicates a strong provision of library services, though 18.9% rated them as needing improvement, which signals room for further improvement.

15. Canteen Facilities

Only 30.5% of parents rated the canteen facilities as excellent, while 29.2% rated them as good. A significant portion (40.3%) rated the facilities as average, indicates their expectation.

16. Basic Amenities of Hostel (Hostel Girls-Only)

Like the canteen, hostel amenities also require improvement, with 40.1% of parents rating them as average. Only 28.2% rated them as excellent, while 31.7% considered them good, indicating a clear need for development.
